

Jess's Message

Dear Trinity,

Grace and peace to all of you this Advent Season!

Advent is all about waiting and preparing for the coming of our savior into the world. This year we know all about what it means to wait. We have been waiting for months to return to normal, to worship in our building, and to visit with friends and family inside our homes. It has been exhausting and at times frustrating, and with the increasing number of COVID cases and deaths, it has been heartbreaking as well. As we enter into Advent, we may not feel as excited or ready as we have in the past. This makes me think about Mary, the mother of Jesus. She was given amazing news that she would bring the Son of God into this world. Most likely she was not ready for the impact this news would make on her life. News of great joy that had brutal consequences during that time where unwed women who became pregnant were subject to public humiliation and even death.

I often wonder how she felt and what she thought about during the months of her pregnancy as she waited for Jesus. How excited she must have been but terrified of the king who was threatened by her son.

So, Mary waited for Jesus to be born. She waited to see him be the Son of God as the angel of the Lord had promised. I bet she was equally frustrated and sometimes fearful just like us as she waited for God's purpose to be fulfilled through her son. She probably never knew what to expect or what would come of Jesus but Mary still had faith in God's sovereignty and love. She is an example to us that in our waiting for Jesus we need to cling to the hope and promise that was fulfilled in him many Christmas' ago. A promise from God that we would never be separated from his love or have to wait on knowing how much we are beloved by our creator. God's love sent his son to be our light and our hope especially in times like these.



As we patiently wait and prepare together to welcome Jesus into this world, may we hold fast to our hope that we will worship together again in person, we will meet for coffee hour and the joys of the church seasons will ring out from our doors. With our hope let us embrace this time of challenge and change in love, creativity and adventure! Part of our adventure this season will be telling Mary's story of waiting and anticipation in new ways with our virtual Lessons and Carols Service, a Zoom Christmas pageant, and our virtual Candlelight Christmas Eve Service. As we continue to pray and hope for this pandemic to end, join me in embracing this unique and different holiday season with excitement and joy in celebrating our beloved savior. A pandemic will not stop us in our waiting from singing, praying and hearing the story of hope this Christmas!


