Sunday School Resumes January 12, 2020




Dear Friends,

Long before SnapFish, Shutterfly and Photoshop, my mother created our own photo Christmas Cards. At first, she used a single photo decorating the card with Christmas themes she carefully cut from Christmas cards using cuticle scissors. After struggling to get three of us to smile at the same time and after my sister was born, she switched form a single photo to individual head shots of each of us. It was a time-consuming process, a true labor of love: She would take a roll (about twelve shots) of each one of us individually. Then she would select the best shot of each once, carefully cut it out, arrange the photos and the graphics until she has what she wanted, and then she would use an enlarger/ to take the final negatives of the card.

While I didn't particularly like the individual photo sessions, I was delighted when I was old enough to help my mother develop the cards. We would spend long hours in the darkroom, with Christmas music playing on the only late-night radio station. Mama would expose the cards and I would develop them. At first, I could only manage one or two at a time, but eventually I was able to move four per bath through the developer, through the stop bath, into the fixer and finally into distilled water.





It truly is a magical process, watching the print gradually appear on the white page. It made me smile every time.

I think that's a good way to understand the New Year. You put in a lot of work over a significant period of time. That's the work of the past. Then you entrust your hard work to a process you may not completely understand. Finally, you watch the future develop.

Trinity is in the middle of our Bicentennial Celebration. We were authorized to form a congregation in the fall of 1819. Our founding fathers and mothers raised the necessary funds (1,745.37½, if you can believe it) and built the core of our current church building. Trinity was consecrated on October 12, 1820 by Bishop James Kemp.



A lot of hard work has been done over the last 200 years. We don't know what the future will bring, but we can trust that God has something great in store for Trinity. We have an important role to play in that future, moving the process along.

With God's help, the future will make us smile just as those pictures did as they appeared in the developing tray so many years ago.

MIDDENDORF LOAN RETIRED



When we decided to build the necessary extension to the building that would allow our Day School to maintain a high enough enrollment to be viable, we raised the majority of the

necessary funds by a capital campaign and promissory notes from parishioners and friends; the balance was funded by a loan from a diocesan fund – The Middendorf Fund.

For the last ten years, the Day School has paid the note on that loan and additional principal of \$5000 (one year of \$10,000) each year. Last year the board voted to set aside \$80,000 in a CD so that the loan could be paid off when it came due the end of December. Since early November, the church and Day School have been working with the Diocesan Finance office to determine the final payoff, ensuring that we are in agreement as to all payments. The Day School Board is happy to report that they cut a check for the balance of the note on December 30 and notified the Diocesan Finance office that the loan was paid in full.

Thank you to everyone who had made it possible for Trinity Church Day School to continue to provide a top notch early childhood education opportunity to the Long Green Valley area. We could not have done it without initial donors, promissory note holders, and day school parents and especially the Parents Club. May many, many more children pass through our wonderful school for many years to come.




