I wanted to update you on my first interesting find at Trinity. Attached you will see the Liberty large cent I found in front of the church. While the coin is so worn that the date is not visible there is enough detail to identify it. There is more in the ground just waiting to be found! The United States large cent was a coin with a face value of 1/100 of a United States dollar. Its nominal diameter was  $1\frac{\nu_8}{8}$  inch (28.57 mm). The first official mintage of the large cent was in 1793, and its production continued until 1857, when it was officially replaced by the modern-size one-cent coin (commonly called the penny).

Large cents were made of nearly pure copper, or copper as pure as it emerged from smelting, without any deliberate addition of other metals (such as occurs in bronze).

#### **BUILDING AND GROUNDS**

The vestry is happy to announce that as of 8/20, Epiphany has finished the stained glass window restoration and they look wonderful! The windows are now protected by custom, exterior plexiglass which will protect them for years to come.

Additionally, the vestry has hired a structural engineer, Doug Gardner, to diagnose the water intrusion issues in the foyer/narthex and along the left interior wall (as you face the altar). The dampness in the foyer is a known issue however the water damage along the interior wall is newer and has accelerated alarmingly over the past year. A report is forth coming and will help the vestry determine a course of action to correct both issues. Thanks to everyone who participated in the on-site, socially distanced visit with Doug and offered up their knowledge about past repairs.

This has been an eventful year so far for us all, individually and as a parish. The vestry is proud of the progress we've made so far on the list of capital improvements which to-date include replacing the roof and gutters, painting the trim, power washing the church, restoring the windows and several other basic maintenance repairs. We want to keep this positive momentum going and now, more than ever, as we begin to tackled the water intrusion issues, the Capital Improvement Fund is critical to our success. Thanks to everyone who has donated to the fund, but also their time in the form of painting, repairs and general clean-up in the church, parish hall and church grounds. We are small, but we are mighty.
